Course Structure

This course is completed over three trimesters within one year of full-time study. It includes 8 core units which includes two field placements totaling 60 days, with 2-3 units per trimester. To qualify, you are required to complete 8 units (48 credit points) as outlined below.

In **Blended** delivery mode, you attend some **face-to-face classes on campus** (70% of all the course) and 30% of the classes are **flexible online units**. You can expect to attend face-to-face classes on campus for about 6 hours a week, and complete about 6 hours of online activities per week in your flexible online units. Plus, you will be expected to complete about 7 hours a week of personal study time.

In **Online** delivery is where you stay home but attend **live online classes** using Microsoft Teams and also do some units that are flexible online units. You will also be able to complete some online learning activities in your own time.

IMPORTANT: Regardless of whether you choose the blended or online option – **you will need to complete 60 days of face-to-face placement** as part of the course.

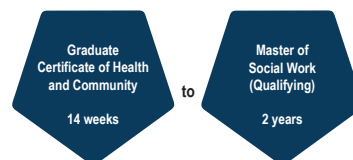

Direct Entry

Applicants must have completed a relevant three-year AQF Level 7 degree, including at least one year (8 units) of full-time study in social and behavioural sciences.

Graduate Certificate Pathway

Applicants with an AQF Level 7 Bachelor's degree, including four relevant units in social and behavioural sciences, and completion of Acknowledge Education's Graduate Certificate in Health and Community, are eligible for entry.

Placement

The Master of Counselling includes a Work Placement and Capstone Project where you undertake clinical practice in a work setting and complete a real-world counselling project. A counselling placement is essential in assisting the transition from application in a simulated setting to real practice.

During your work placement, you will also complete a practical capstone project in a counselling environment. The practicum involves the completion of 12 hours work each week for 12 weeks along with 24 hours to attend individual counselling supervision with the workplace supervisor and group supervision by teleconference with the Lecturer.

Students can undertake their placement at Australian Counselling Services (ACS), AIPC's own counselling clinic.

English Requirements

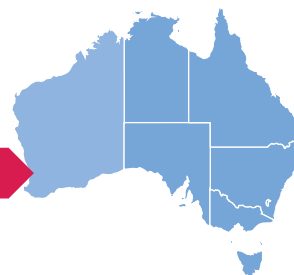
You must meet one of the following:

- ✓ IELTS: Overall score of 6.5 in the Academic IELTS with a minimum of 6.0 in each band, or
- ✓ PTE Academic: Overall score of 58 with a minimum score of 50 in each band, or
- ✓ At least one year of University studies in Australia in the last two years, or
- ✓ Evidence of at least 5 years of studies in an English speaking country (Australia, New Zealand, UK, Canada, USA, South Africa or Ireland), or
- ✓ Acknowledge Education English Test., or equivalent.

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
