English Language Requirement (ELR) change for PG FBE courses – mid year onwards



New! FBE approved a blanket waiver for ELRs for FBE PG courses from mid-year onwards:

- FBE applicants who have completed at least the final two years of their undergraduate degree in an approved English-speaking country may now satisfy the ELRs without needing an English test.

Previously: applicants must complete their entire undergraduate degree in an approved English-speaking country.

Now: applicants only need to have completed the final 2 years (or more) of their undergraduate degree in an English-speaking country and graduate with that qualification.

Example: 2+2 degrees where the final two years are completed in an approved English -speaking country can meet ELRs

Completion of an undergraduate degree, or a graduate degree (of at least 2 years duration) in English

If you've completed an undergraduate degree, or a graduate degree of at least two years duration, where the degree was taught and assessed entirely in English¹, you may satisfy the University's English requirements.

If the degree was completed:

- **within two years** of your commencement to study at the University of Melbourne, then no additional evidence of English language proficiency is required.
- **between two and five years** of your commencement to study at the University of Melbourne, evidence of work² in an English-speaking environment is required.
- **more than five years** of your commencement to study at the University of Melbourne, evidence that sustained work² in a **designated English-speaking country**, in an English-speaking environment, has been undertaken since completing the degree will be required.

Notes:

¹ This does not apply if the institution you studied at is located in China, India, Nepal, Pakistan or Saudi Arabia. If you have completed your tertiary studies in another non-English speaking country, you will need to submit the following documentation with your application:

- A letter on official letterhead or an email from an official staff member email account, which is from the Academic Registrar or a suitable delegate, and specifies either:
 - That **all** degrees at the institution are entirely taught and assessed in English, **OR**
 - That the specific degree you completed was entirely taught and assessed in English.

The notification must apply to both the awarding institution and the institution you studied at (if different).

ELR change for PG FBE courses – mid year onwards



Please note the following exceptions still apply:

- If the relevant study was completed more than 2 years ago, applicants will still need to provide evidence of work experience in line with the existing ELR requirements.
- Usual exclusions on Unimelb ELR webpage still apply (e.g. qualifications completed in China, India, Nepal, Pakistan, or Saudi Arabia would not meet the requirement, even if taught in English).
- Waiver does not apply to courses where the minimum WAM requirement is below 65 (e.g. Graduate Certificate in Business).

Actions

- Admissions teams are already reviewing current conditional offer holders
- New conditional offers with updated requirements will be issued (if applicable)
- Please check the new conditional offers carefully – changes to the conditions may mean that the students may now be eligible for a conditional CoE

Completion of an undergraduate degree, or a graduate degree (of at least 2 years duration) in English

If you've completed an undergraduate degree, or a graduate degree of at least two years duration, where the degree was taught and assessed entirely in English¹, you may satisfy the University's English requirements.

If the degree was completed:

- **within two years** of your commencement to study at the University of Melbourne, then no additional evidence of English language proficiency is required.
- **between two and five years** of your commencement to study at the University of Melbourne, evidence of work² in an English-speaking environment is required.
- **more than five years** of your commencement to study at the University of Melbourne, evidence that sustained work² in a [designated English-speaking country](#), in an English-speaking environment, has been undertaken since completing the degree will be required.
