Grant	Adelaide 'Be The First' Welcome Grant
Grant Amount	AU \$2000
Eligibility Criteria	To be eligible for the Grant, an applicant must: 1. be an International Student; 2. be applying for admission to a CRICOS registered Coursework Program leading to an Award and commencing at Adelaide University in 2026; 3. not previously have been enrolled in a Program of the same AQF Level at the University of South Australia, the University of Adelaide, or Adelaide University; and 4. accept an unconditional Offer of Admission by the Grant Acceptance Due Date.
Grant Terms & Conditions	The award of the Grant is subject to the following terms and conditions: 1. At the Census Date of the semester in which the Grant is payable, the Grant recipient must: a. be an International Student; b. be enrolled with a full-time study load or a study load in accordance with an approved Study Plan; c. be enrolled in the Program included in the Offer of Admission (unless otherwise approved by Adelaide University); and d. have an Australian bank account registered in the name of the Grant recipient, the details of which have been provided to Adelaide University in the manner requested by Adelaide University. 2. Adelaide University will pay the grant directly to the Grant recipient's Australian bank account following the Census Date of the semester in which the Grant is payable. 3. The Grant is not transferable to a third party. 4. The Grant cannot be deferred to a different commencing intake. 5. If an applicant receives more than one Offer of Admission with a scholarship and/or grant for the Program, the latest Offer of Admission will supersede all previous Offers of Admission issued to the applicant. 6. The offer of Grant will be withdrawn by Adelaide University if the recipient's Offer of Admission is withdrawn for any reason. 7. The recipient must notify the Adelaide University area responsible for scholarship and grant administration immediately if, prior to payment of the Grant, the recipient:

	a. intends to transfer to another Program within Adelaide University; b. intends to discontinue full-time study in the Program; c. intends to transfer to another institution; d. ceases to be an International Student; or e. intends to defer their studies and/or apply for Leave of Absence. 8. AU reserves the right to make changes to scholarship and grant terms and conditions without notice. In the event of any such change, all current recipients of a Grant or offer of a Grant will continue to have the Terms and Conditions applicable at the time the Grant was awarded honoured. 9. The recipient is encouraged to seek independent advice on any tax implications of the Grant. 10. Applicants accepting an Offer of Admission with a Grant, or accepting any other written offer of a Grant from Adelaide University (including by exchange of emails), are deemed to accept these Terms and Conditions.
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Definitions	In this document unless expressed or implied to the contrary:
Award	means the qualification conferred upon a student following the successful completion of an academic Program. The categories of award include: Associate Degree, Diploma, Bachelor Degree, Honours Degree, Degree with Honours, Graduate Certificate, Graduate Diploma, Master Degree (both coursework and research), Doctoral Degree (both coursework and research) and Higher Doctorate;
AQF Level	means one of the 10 levels of the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF), which is a national system for classifying qualifications based on their complexity and depth of learning;
Census Date	means the date within each Study Period (or research period for research degree programs) by which a student's enrolment must be finalised for a course, and applicable fees and charges are incurred. It is the last day that a student can withdraw from a course and have it deleted from their academic record. It is also the deadline for various financial requirements, including submission of request for Commonwealth support and HECS-HELP form; submission of request for FEE-HELP Assistance; payment of any up-front payment of student contribution; obtaining a HECS-HELP loan; or supplying a Tax File Number;
Course	means the basic component of an academic Program and is sometimes referred to as a subject. Each course is assigned a unit value, generally 6 units per course, reflecting the proportion of academic progress within the total unit requirements of the Program;

Coursework Program	means a mode of study constituted of courses involving directed learning as either face-to-face learning, online learning, or a combination of these;
Grant Acceptance Due Date	means 31 October 2025 for Programs commencing in semester 1 2026 and 31 March 2026 for Programs commencing semester 2 2026;
International Student	means a person studying in Australia who is not an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident, New Zealand citizen, or holder of an Australian permanent resident humanitarian visa.
Leave of Absence	means a time period during which <i>Adelaide University</i> permits a student to remain unenrolled from courses but retain their place in a program.
Offer of Admission	means a letter issued to a successful international applicant detailing the Program for which they are being offered admission;
Program	means an approved combination of courses to obtain a degree, certificate or diploma;
Study Period	means the time over which a course is run, for example a trimester, a semester, or an intensive; and
Study Plan	means a schedule for an individual student that lists a recommended sequence for undertaking all Courses within their Program.
