Apply for the Industry Based Learning (IBL) Computer Science and IT Program at Bendigo

The IBL program has been developed to allow students to extend their formal academic learning beyond the classroom. The subject encourages students to bring their learning from University into the work place and test out their knowledge in a 'real world' job.

What's in it for me?

- Receive assistance in finding a work placement
- Receive academic credit for a work placement
- Relate your work experience back to the theory you've learnt in the Computer Science and IT discipline. Learn how the theory and skills learnt in your degree are applied in the professional working environment.
- Undertake job application and pre-placement training prior to starting your placement. Develop the skills and knowledge required to secure a placement and make the most of your time in the workplace.
- Support from the IBL Coordinator while undertaking your placement.

Subject features

- Students are paid a stipend up to \$30,000 for undergraduate and \$6,000 for postgraduate.
- Subjects runs across Semester 1, Semester 2
- Industry placement academic credit
- Undergraduate; up to 40 weeks of full time industry experience. Postgraduate, 12 weeks of part-time industry experience. Hours may vary depending on organisation.
- · Work undertaken project or operationally based
- · LTU sourced placements
- Students with self-sourced placements are also encouraged to apply
- Undergraduate IBL subjects CSE3IBA (20 weeks), CSE3IBB (20 weeks), CSE3IEA (12 weeks)
- Postgraduate IBL subject CSE5IBL (12 weeks)

Approved courses

This program is available to students from all Computer Science and Information Technology courses.

Eligibility

- Undergraduate
 - o Students must have completed at least 180 credit points
 - o Students must have at least a C average at the time of application
 - Must have at least two elective subjects available (30 credit points) in your course load to undertake both CSE3IBA and CSE3IBB
- Postgraduate
 - o Students must have completed at least 75 credit points
 - Master of ICT students must reserve two elective subjects in your study plan to undertake CSE5IBL
